- I understand the relationships between the circumference and area of a circle.

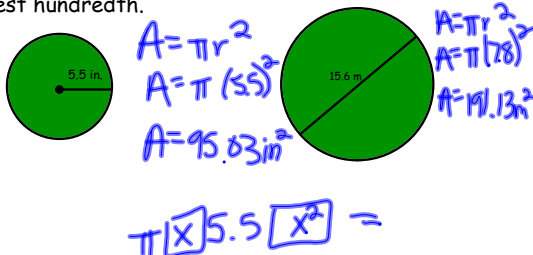
Story Time

Sir Cumference and
the Dragon of Pi

The ratio of the circumference of a circle to its diameter is the irrational number called π (pi). We often use 3.14 or $22/7$ as approximations.

If a circle has a radius of r units, then the formula to find the area is $A = \pi r^2$ square units.

Find the area of each circle. Round each answer to the nearest hundredth.
